Dear friends,

Next weekend we will welcome Fr. Dominic Nyamai Munini to our parish for a Mission Appeal. Fr. Dominic is a priest of the Diocese of Machakos in Kenya. Each year the Archdiocese assigns a mission to our parish. I am happy that Fr. Dominic will be here to share with us about his Diocese. I have talked to him on the phone and I can assure you that he is easy to understand.

Machakos Diocese was established in 1969 and the first two bishops were the first two priests. The present bishop is Rt. Rev. Martin Kivuva Musonde. To date, there are 125 native priests and 20 missionaries' priests. There are 140 native sisters out of a total of 213 and 23 native brothers. There are 52 parishes with 1,030 mission stations. The Catholic population is 862,088 in a population of 2,138,000. There are 131 senior seminarians.

I hope you will welcome Fr. Dominic and be generous to his Diocese!!
